

CAMP WHIPPOORWILL CLOTHING AND EQUIPMENT LIST

Following is a list of clothing and equipment suggested in the light of our experience over past years. We wish our campers to be properly equipped at the least possible expense; you will probably own most of the items already.

Clothes that require special laundering are not appropriate.

It is very important that shoes and boots fit well.

Complete rain protection and adequate clothing for chilly weather are essential.

Storage space is limited. Overnight laundry service is provided once each week.

Please bring only what you need.

CLOTHING

- 10 shirts (**see note below re: camp shirts)
- 5 shorts
- 4 jeans *or* long pants
- 1 wool or fleece sweater *or* jacket (**not** cotton)
- 1 wind parka or jacket
- 1 sweat shirt
- 10 sets underwear
- 10 pairs cotton socks
- 4 pairs wool socks for hiking *
- 1 raincoat with hood or hat, **required**
- 1 terry robe (*optional*)
- 2 sets pajamas
- 2 swim suits (one should have full coverage, for trips)
- 1 hat with brim, or cap for sun protection ***
- 1 wool or fleece hat for warmth on trips (needed)
- 1 wicking t-shirt *
- 1 simple skirt or dress (*optional*)

LINEN

- 2 laundry bags
- 2 warm blankets, *or* 1 quilt/comforter and
1 warm blanket
- 4 sheets to fit mattress 74" x 30"
- 1 pillow
- 2 pillow cases
- 4 bath towels
- 2 wash cloths

FOOTWEAR

- 1 pair high-top boots for hiking
- 1 pair sneakers
- 1 pair old or inexpensive sneakers to wear at water-front and on canoe trips, **or** closed-toe water shoes
- 1 pair smooth-soled sneakers for tennis
- 1 pair flip-flops or "teva"-type sandals for shower
- 1 pair riding boots with heels (*we can provide boots, but some campers may wish to bring their own*)

TOILET ARTICLES

- Flashlight and batteries, **required**
- Toothbrush and case, Toothpaste
- Soap and soap case
- Shampoo
- Comb and Brush
- Plastic cup
- Sanitary supplies
- Sunscreen

FOR TRIPS *

- Sleeping bag and Stuff sack
- Poncho
- Small day pack
- 2 Water Bottles, 1 quart or 1 liter capacity each
- Plastic bag or stuff sack for toilet articles
- Sleeping pad (optional for older campers)

OTHER DESIRABLE ITEMS

- Writing paper
- Envelopes with self-sticking stamps
- Pencils, pen
- Sunglasses
- Tennis racquet and tennis balls
- Softball glove, Lacrosse stick, Soccer shoes
- Camera and film
- Insect repellent (containing 10-30% DEET)
- Books
- Games
- Musical instrument
- Fins, mask, snorkel
- Fishing tackle
- Pocket knife
- "Crazy-Creek" type folding seat
- Riding helmet (*we provide helmets, but some campers may wish to bring their own*)
- Bike helmet (*campers may wish to bring their own*)
- Spare glasses (or prescription)

EACH ARTICLE OF CLOTHING (including sneakers, boots and shoes) and EVERY ITEM OF EQUIPMENT MUST BE CLEARLY MARKED WITH THE CAMPER'S NAME!

Please do **not** bring valuables such as expensive watches, jewelry, cameras, or CD players to camp.

Clothing and equipment may be shipped ahead in duffel bags, a small trunk, or handbags.

Two moderate-size duffel bags may be brought on the camp bus (we can't transport trunks on the bus).
